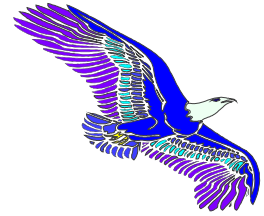

Medications—End of the School Year Procedures...

The Wisconsin state medication law states *that parents must pick up any prescription and/or over-the-counter medication from school.* Schools are not allowed to send remaining medication home with students. **Parents need to pick up any prescription and/or over-the-counter medication from the health aide by the end of the day on Wed., June 8th.**

Parents should send only the amount of medication your child needs to school during June to avoid having extra medication remaining on the last day of school.

Emergency Medications: Inhalers, Epi-pens, Glucagon

Students who have inhalers, Epi-pens and/or Glucagon at school can take their medication home with them on the last day of school with the parent's written permission.

Medication left at school will be disposed of on Thurs., June 9th.
