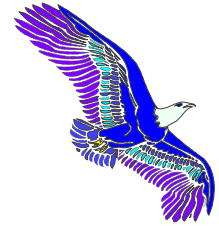

STATE MANDATED TEST RESULTS WERE MAILED:

As you recall, all students in grades 3-8 and grade 10 must take a state-federal required test. Students in grades 3 and 5 were tested in reading and math, while the 4th graders were tested in reading, math, language, science, social studies, and writing. The results for each curriculum tested were reported in four performance levels: minimal, basic, proficient, and advanced.

The results of the above mentioned testing which had been made available to the schools were recently mailed to parents. Please review these results with your child(ren) and if you have questions, please contact your child's teacher.
